Remarks by H. E. Mr. HAYASHI Hajime, Ambassador of Japan to the UK, for the Opening Ceremony of Japanese Peace Garden in Coventry at Coventry War Memorial Park on Friday, July 2, 2021

Lord Mayor McNicholas, Councillors, Distinguished Guests, Members of Coventry Young Ambassadors,

My wife and I have indeed been looking forward to joining you today on the occasion of the Opening Ceremony of Japanese Peace Garden in Coventry. I sincerely congratulate all of you here for the opening of this outstanding place, which has been completed by the efforts of City of Coventry, Coventry primary schools, War Memorial Park and Japanese Garden Society.

Obviously, Coventry is a renowned international city of peace, supporting schools to promote peace and reconciliation through education as well as holding the annual Hiroshima Day Service.
