Remarks by H. E. Mr. HAYASHI Hajime. Ambassador of Japan to the UK, for the Manchester Tokyo 2020 Event on 12 October, 2021

I would sincerely like to express my deep appreciation for the enthusiastic way in which people in the UK embraced the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games.
