

Remarks by Ambassador HAYASHI Hajime  
for the Kyoto Prize at Oxford 2022  
at Oxford University Museum of Natural History on 10th May, 2022

Vice-Chancellor Richardson, Professor Woods, and Distinguished Guests,

It gives me great pleasure to attend the Kyoto Prize at Oxford Laureates' Leadership Panel and dinner in this beautiful setting this evening.

I would like to express my deepest admiration for the great achievements of the three 2021 Kyoto Prize Laureates, Professor Roeder, Professor Yao, and Professor Latour, and to convey my heartfelt congratulations to them. I would also like to express my sincere appreciation for the unstinting support by the Inamori Foundation and the outstanding contribution made by those who were involved in organising this prestigious event, returning in person after two years.
