## Remarks by H.E Hajime Hayashi, Ambassador of Japan to the UK, at the awarding the Ambassador's Commendation to Professor Dr. Alessio Patalano on Thursday 15th June 2023

Professor Patalano, Distinguished Guests,

Good evening. My wife and I would like to extend our heartfelt welcome to you all.

It is my great pleasure to have an opportunity to honour Prof. Alessio Patalano for his outstanding contribution in enhancing the security and defence ties between Japan and the UK.

Prof. Patalano has been at the forefront of advancing European countries' understanding of the Indo-Pacific region. His academic influence played a significant role in the UK Government's launch of the "Indo Pacific tilt" as part of the Integrated Review in 2021, and its subsequent reinforcement in the IR Refresh this March, solidifying the region as a permanent pillar of the UK's international policy.

In addition, he guided young cadets from the JMSDF and RN on a cultural tour of the Imperial War Museum. These personnel exchanges obviously hold significance for the future of bilateral partnership.

Prof. Patalano has also played an invaluable role in effectively disseminating Japan's policies and views. His active presence online has provided readers with a deeper understanding of the latest updates in Japan's security and defence landscape, such as Japan's National Security Strategy, and the Japan-UK Reciprocal Access Agreement (RAA) and its significance. His research agenda has also extended to major defence equipment programs, such as the Global Combat Air Programme (GCAP), showcasing his breadth of knowledge and engagement.

We gather here this evening to express our utmost appreciation to Prof. Patalano for his contributions in enhancing the security and defence ties, as well as the friendship, between Japan and the UK, as I just described partially. With his profound insights, unwavering dedication, and commitment to fostering bilateral relations, I am pretty sure that he is truly a worthy recipient of the Ambassador's Commendation. Let us celebrate his achievements and look forward to his continued efforts for a bright future between our countries.
