It is a great pleasure for me to attend today's groundbreaking ceremony of 72 Upper Ground.

This is a huge redevelopment project on prime land in central London, utilizing the site of the iconic former ITV headquarters, surrounded by tourist destinations and cultural attractions.

When completed, this new building will provide many affordable offices for young creative talents and start-ups.

Just as the Thames has connected the city and brought people together, I hope this new office re-development, situated on the beautiful banks of the Thames, will become a popular venue where people from all walks of life come out to interact, and enjoy

themselves.
